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During the conference in Haifa the representatives of Ex Libris, IGeLU and ELUNA finally signed the "Agreement on the procedure for additions of resources to the Ex Libris Knowledge Bases" (<a href="http://igelu.org/development-cooperation/enhancements/ckb-enhancements">http://igelu.org/development-cooperation/enhancements/ckb-enhancements</a>). This agreement may not be snappily titled, but by confirming the process for getting resources added to the SFX/Verde/MetaLib Central Knowledge Bases it represents an important milestone in ensuring fairness and balance in how resources are assigned.

Under the terms of the agreement all IGeLU/ELUNA members can use NERS to vote in an 8-week cycle for resources to be added to the CKBs. For their part Ex Libris commits to implementing (where technically possible) the top 4 "general" resources, plus a further top 2 resources from one "region" each cycle. The region being selected for changes every voting cycle.

The agreement was based on discussions and work dating back more than a year – many of you will be aware that we have been running the process in pilot form since the Ghent conference in 2010 – but in Haifa we were able to finalise and agree on this as the way forward for future resource additions.

So please do remember to use this opportunity to get resources in to the CKBs that are important for you, and for your region!

+++++The Minds Have Joined

There has been much discussion within IGeLU during 2010/11 on the future of the MetaLib Product Working Group, and in particular the need to consider its relationship with the Primo PWG (see http://igelu.org/archives/2358).

The discussion has been driven by the maturity of the MetaLib product; the difficulty of finding new recruits to serve on the PWG; and the emergence of the Primo Central Index and MetaLib+. The two groups have a common interest in resource issues, and in the Primo front-end.

The subject was discussed again at a combined MetaLib/Primo business meeting at the Haifa conference last month, where a unanimous decision was made to join the groups together to form a double PWG, rather than to merge. This was felt to be a better solution than either fully merging, or continuing as separate groups, as it underlines the need for the communities of both products to continue to have separate voices, but to work together on common issues within a framework of mutual coordination, cooperation, and support.

The details of the new joint Primo/MetaLib PWG have yet to be resolved, but Mandy Stewart (Primo) and Jeremy Acland (MetaLib) will provide join coordination, with Lukas Koster acting as the liaison with the IGeLU Steering Committee. Group members will have product-specific responsibilities. There will be a joint face-to-face meeting for the two groups early in the new year.

All in all this is a highly satisfactory outcome to what has been a difficult question to resolve. Could a join Primo and MetaLib PWG be a precedent to a new structure within IGeLU that is flexible, and able to evolve in the light of its URM, URD2 and data services orientation?

++++Aleph PWG

The Aleph PWG met at Haifa for a product update by Carmit Marcus, the Ex Libris Aleph Product Manager, as well as for the annual business meeting. This meeting was very well attended (with additional chairs brought in to accommodate the large audience). Carmit reviewed the many IGeLU enhancements that will be in version 21 and due for release in January 2012.

Mike Ryan, the PWG Coordinator, briefed the membership on PWG activities over the past year, most of which involved reviewing and approving enhancement specifications for version 21, and coordinator with ELUNA in preparation for the next voting cycle on NERS. NERS voting is still scheduled for October 15<sup>th</sup> to November 1<sup>st</sup>.

The membership completed the meeting by confirming PWG positions (see <a href="http://igelu.org/products/aleph">http://igelu.org/products/aleph</a>).

+++++Special Interest Working Group

In this year's meeting, the Consortia Special Interest Working Group (SIWG) focused on the main topic "Alma and Consortia". The session was attended by about 40 people and split into two 45 minute blocks. During the first half, participants discussed impressions, observations, thoughts and misgivings concerning a common future "in the cloud". A vivid conversation took place with many people contributing. In the second block, Axel Kaschte (Strategy Director Europe) and Asaf Kline (Alma Software Architect) discussed with participants upcoming topics.

Manufacturer and users exchanged views in an open and concentrated atmosphere. Though more and more consortia issues in the Alma environment are becoming clearer, there are still many things to be discussed and decided.

## +++++Elections and Personnel

At Haifa we said goodbye to Pat Busby, who has completed her term on the Steering Committee. Her contributions to IGeLU will be sorely missed.

With her departure two of the IGeLU Steering Committee positions came up for election by the Assembly of Members. After the votes were counted Peter Klien (Austrian Library Network) was newly appointed, while Michael Fake (London School of Economics) was confirmed for a second term.
