Reichman University

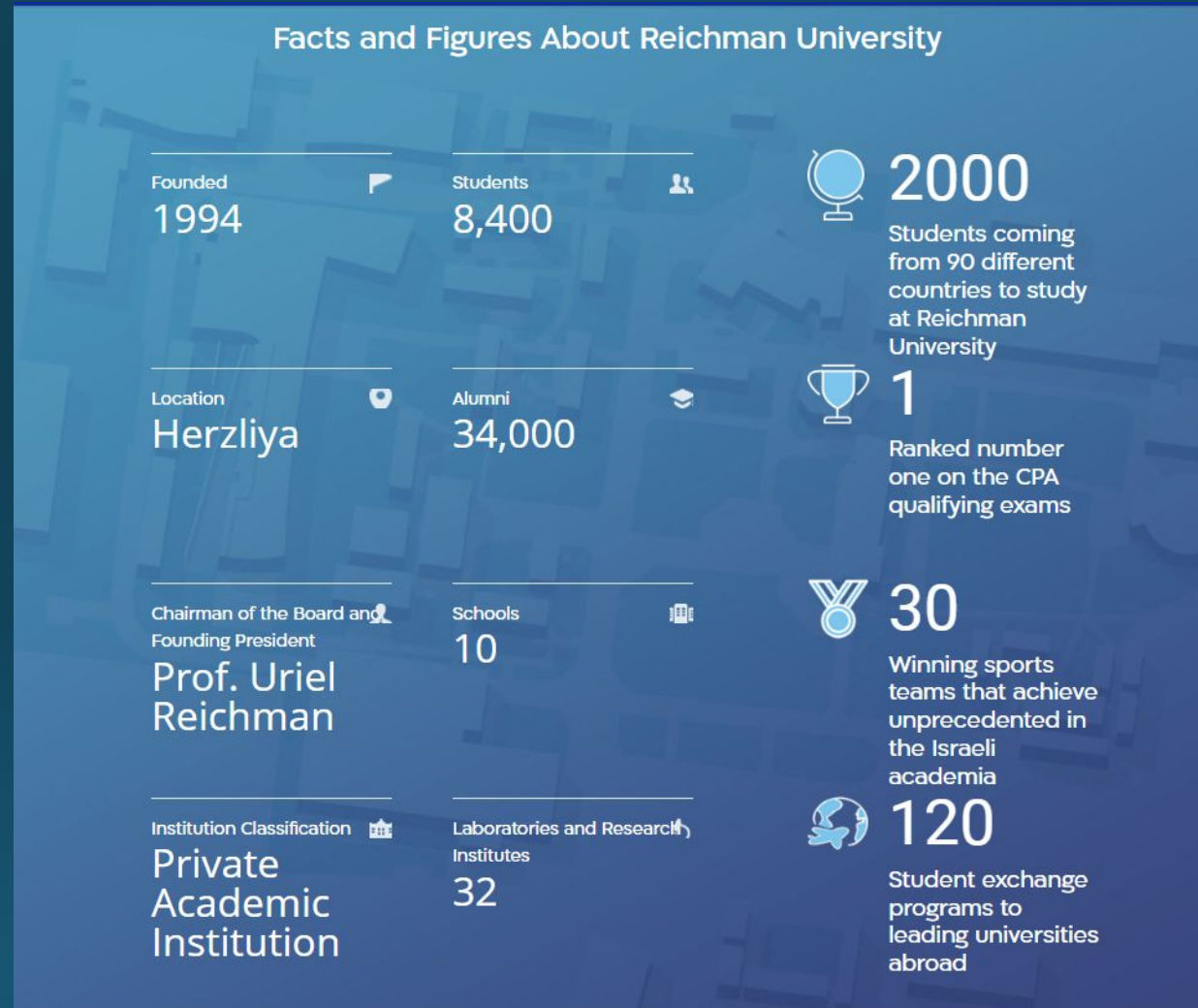
- 1994 - Founded by Professor Uriel Reichman under name: The Interdisciplinary Center, as the first private academic institution in Israel.
- 2021 - Became University and changed the name to Reichman University.
- 10 schools of various disciplines, dozens of programs undergraduate and advanced degrees, many research institutes.

Main goal: Academic study with practical, hands-on training

Main vision: Leadership and social responsibility

ICC

- 2004 - Israeli College Consortium, a group of 48 different libraries in Israel, was founded.
- 2005 - ICC implemented Aleph in the unique model of SAS Software as a System + Outsourced Solution
- 2012 – Started implementing Primo
- 2016 – Alma early adaptors

ICC services and benefits



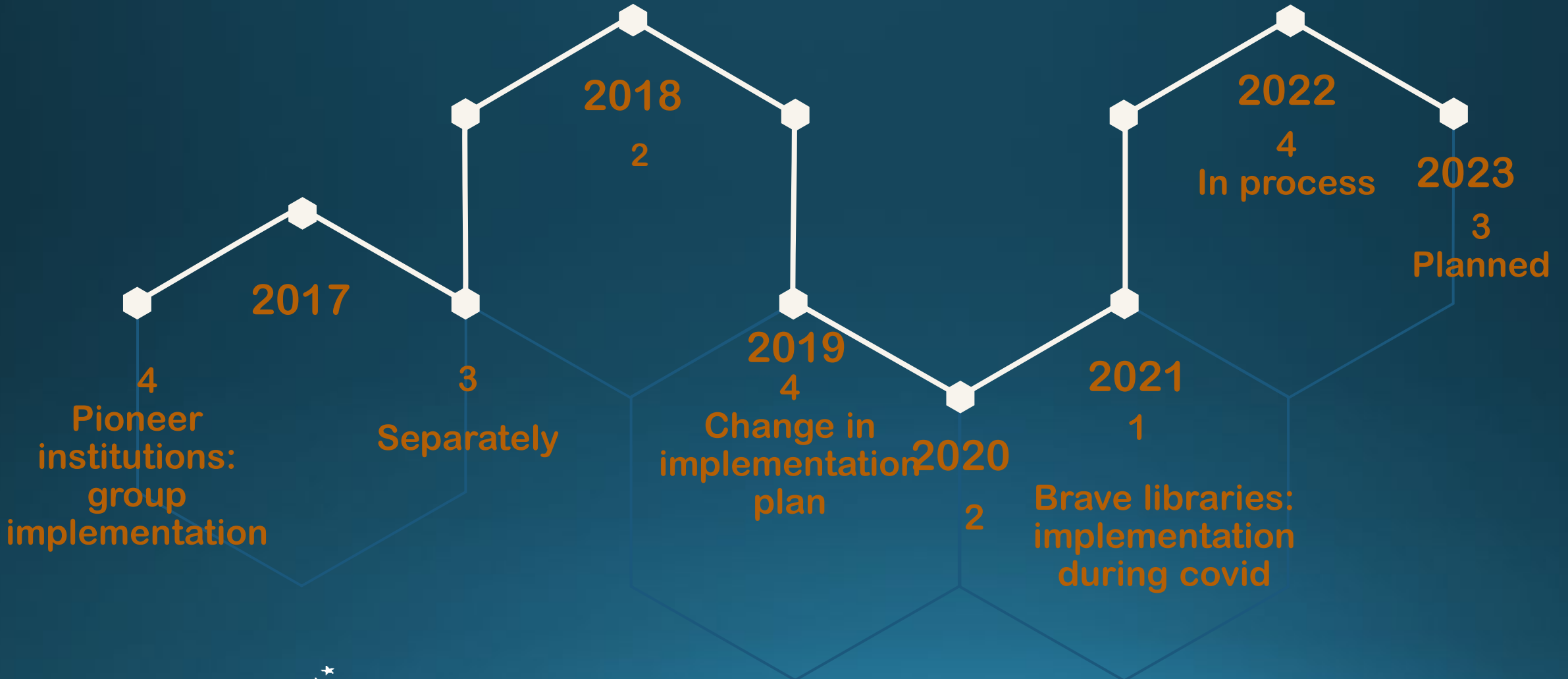
- Economy of Scale

Alma implementation: Problems and rays of hope

Prior to the implementation

- Lack of qualified human resources
- Lack of understanding how to prepare the data and the differences between Aleph and Alma workflows
- Bad communication re the integrations with other systems: between the IT dept, libraries, providers.
- No documentation in Hebrew



Alma implementation: Problems and rays of hope

During the implementation

- Communication problems with Exlibris teams
- Coordination issues with IT dept.
- Different size, needs and resources of the libraries in the group



Alma implementation: Problems and rays of hope

After the implementation

- Quick move from implementation to support
- Unfinished issues
- Problems with integration with other systems – mainly SIS. Systems (Rashim, Beit Hashita)
- Abandoned workflows



Alma implementation: Rays of hope

- Cooperative and helpful implementation team
- Help and support from ICC managerial team
- Acquaintance and friendship
- Physical distance

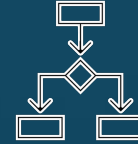


Alma implementation: Insights and course of action

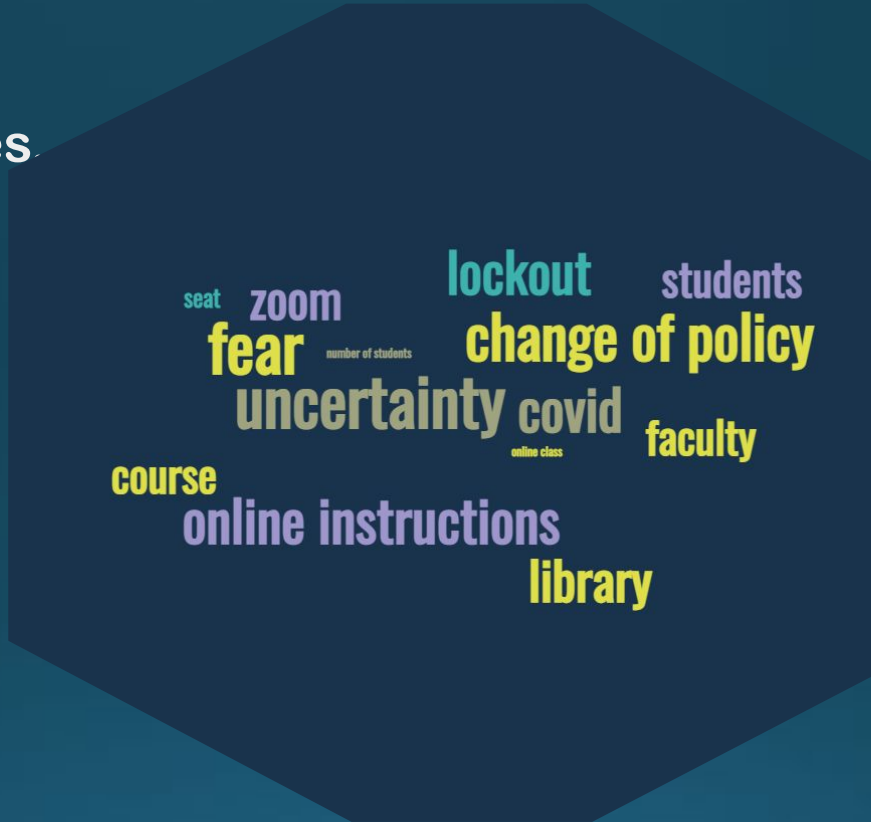

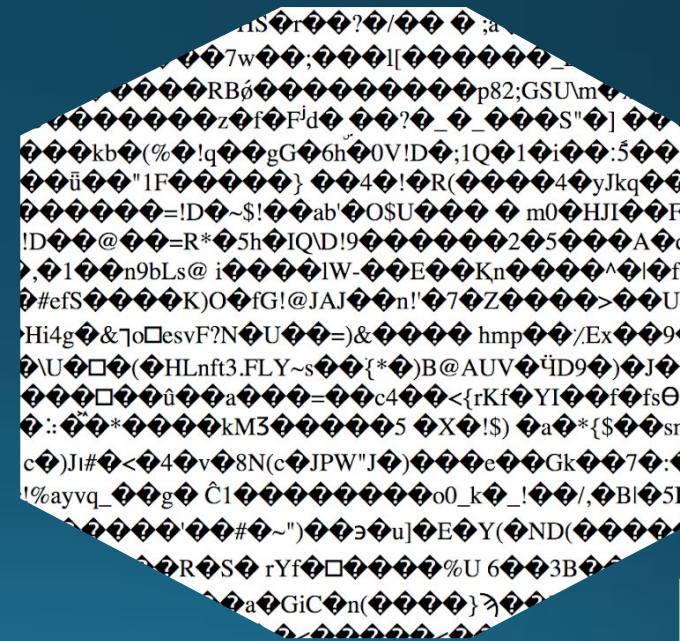

(Through MELI PWG, ICC meetings and independent initiatives)

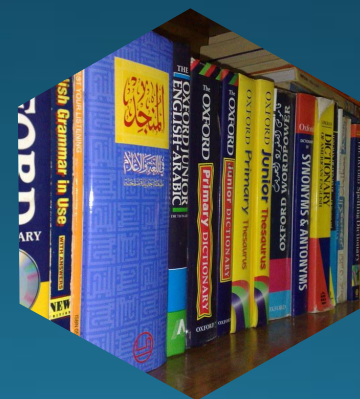
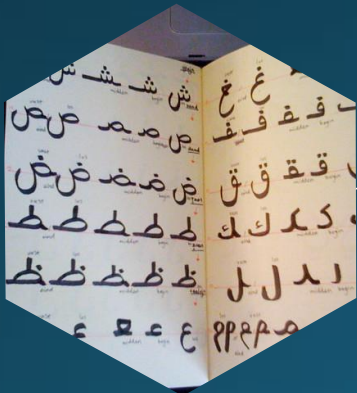
- Opening of cases and collection of examples

- Building a collection of articles from Academic journals in Arabic

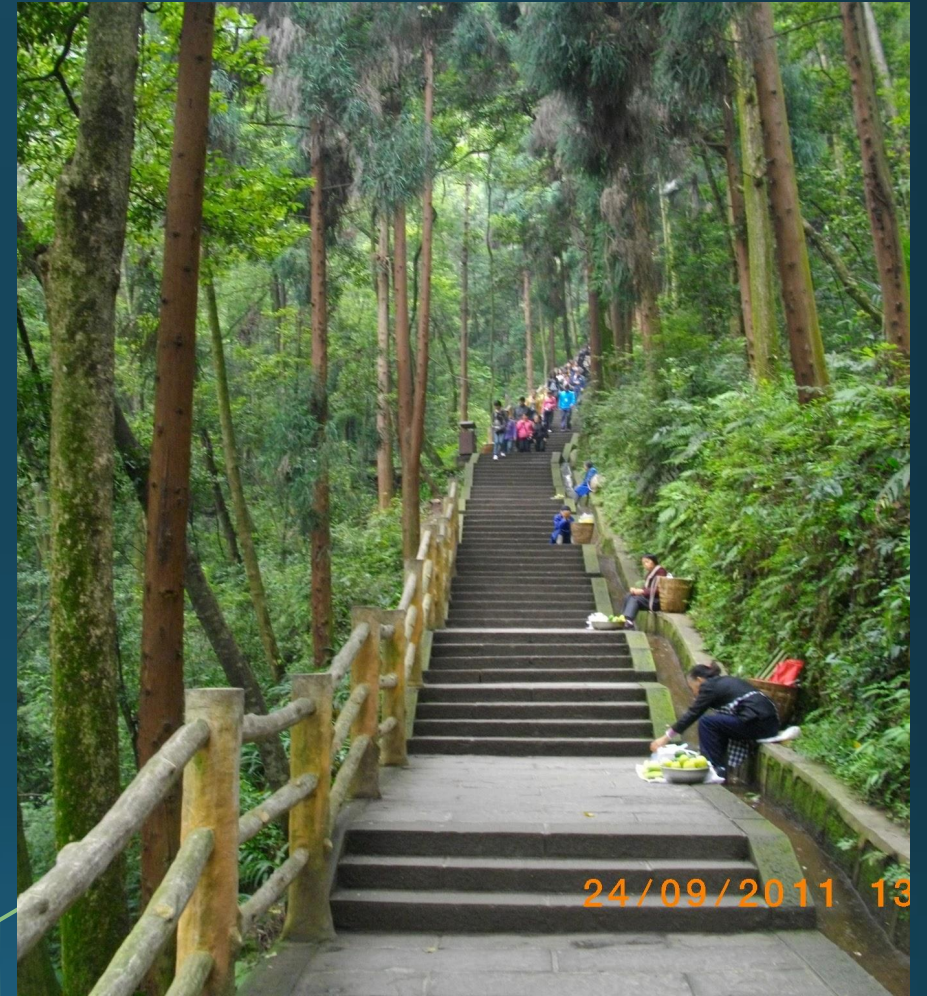
