- LCSH is reviewing the "Indians of North America" subject headings

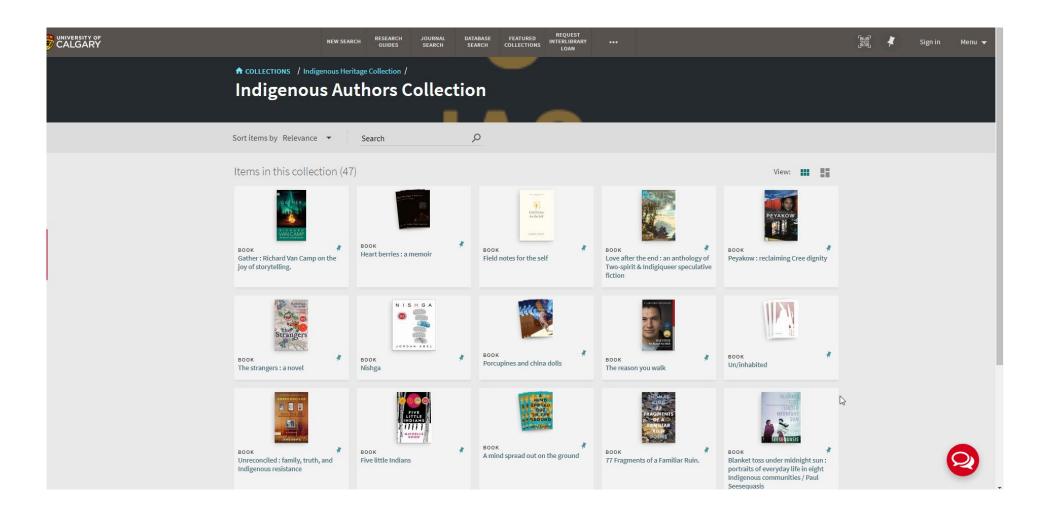
