WHAT WE DO

Our key goals include providing the following Analytics support:

- Data Understanding
- Data Access
- Data Consistency
- Education and Advocacy



DATA UNDERSTANDING

Data is difficult and it can be difficult to:

- Understand where the data is coming from.
- Understand why you are getting the data results that you are getting.
- ❖ Understand how you can use the data.



DATA ACCESS

We trust Ex Libris with a substantial amount of data from our institutions and this trust comes the understanding:

- Data will be available for accessing by institutions either through API, batch processing, or Oracle Analytics.
- The community want the flexibility to access their data for data warehouses and visualization tools.



DATA CONSISTENCY

The Analytics CoP continuously gathers and analyzes evidence to support the improvement of Oracle Analytics.

Some of those improvements include:

- Bugs found in the data (incorrect data returns).
- Incorrect mapping of data fields from Ex Libris products to analytics.
- Data not provided/mapped at all.
- Addressing issues as a result of incomplete/incorrect Ex Libris documentation.



EDUCATION AND ADVOCACY

The Analytics CoP strives to represent the larger Ex Libris community and advocate for data improvements. We are your voice!!

In addition, our role as educators of data cannot be understated. This is done through our interactions with the community on listservs and through presentations at conferences.



MAJOR PROJECTS OF 2021

- Implemented question monitoring for Analytics and Alma listservs.
- Inconsistent measure report project completion.
- Event/System Event data return enhancements/additions project completion.
- First cross product analytic update.



2022 ROADMAP

- Began data dictionary work in July with first overview from Ex Libris.
- Leganto Analytics. Began work within a Basecamp with Ex Libris to review canned reports and expanded usefulness of those reports.
- Expanding our cooperation with other working groups.
- Expand roster to include additional members from IGeLU and Ex Libris. Currently looking for an additional member from both organizations.
- Providing feedback on the Analytics UI Update
- Added our new Deputy Coordinator Maya Amichal.
- We also hope to begin working with Ex libris on the long-awaited Alma canned report revisions.
