



- Founded in 1904
- Campus university in Leeds
- Member of the Russell Group of research-intensive universities.
- ~39,000 students: 28,300 undergraduates, 10,700 postgraduates
- 9,200 staff

- User Group/Community
- Tight timeframe

- 18 month project
 - Minerva (VLE)
 - Data migration
 - IT involvement in data migration

 - Recruitment!



Migration of Data

- c.4500 existing lists to move across.
- Decision made to transfer (nearly) everything
- Substantial IT representation in project group.
- Representation included lead architect of previous in-house reading lists system.



Julia Crick and Elisabeth van Houts, ed. A social history of England, 900-1200 (Cambridge: CUP, 2011)




Migration of Data


- Migration script tested on pilot data and then refined through testing and feedback.
- Amount of data involved required a phased approach. (5 transfer batches)
- How to capture updates (and not duplicate work)?
- Migration process caused formatting and other errors.
- 6x Project Assistants working on cleaning-up migrated lists.



Workflow Development

- Where to start? so many configuration options!
- Start from principles: Don't try to recreate existing workflows.
- Ex Libris default workflows don't necessarily fit our context.
- Collaborative process a subset of the reading list team formed a Leganto Implementation Team.







Workflow Development

- Initially a (very slow) online process.
- Worked with a consultant to map existing processes + identify areas of improvement.
- Transitioned to face-to-face sprint workshops.
- Iterative process try it, it doesn't matter if it doesn't work.
- User community = invaluable.

Tutor Engagement

- Starting from an interesting place more difficult to outline benefits of new system.
- Frank and open about the reasons for migration.
- No Academic Liaison Librarians need to be creative in identifying comms channels.
- Pilot of limited value to wider engagement.





Tutor Engagement

- Early outreach in Spring 2022 to introduce system and ask for feedback on existing processes.
- Led to wider (and invaluable) user experience research project in the Summer.
- Regular training drop-in session across the Summer/Autumn.
- Still working on process for regular reading list reminders (and tracking engagement for Semester 1)

Reflections – Timeline

- Difficult to fit into another project's timeline.
- A follow-up onboarding period would have been extremely useful.
- Fine-tuning config will be an ongoing activity. (as will Analytics)
- Great opportunity to use project time to rethink how we gather feedback from users.

Reflections – Project Setup

- Composition of the project team (and Board) was well considered.
- Realistic budgeting from the outset was important as the project developed.
- Knock-on effects on Metadata team were overlooked.
- Other systems have had significant impact on project (e.g. Module Catalogue)



Reflections – Staff Development

- Team have adapted to new system and processes extremely well.
- The project has created new posts but also development opportunities for existing staff.
- Cross-pollination of skills will take time.
