

Digital Collections Catalyst 2020

Dr. Keir Winesmith began with a deep dive into State Library's collection of Brisbane maps and histories. He then developed a predictive mapping project to help visualise and analyse evolving Brisbane futures.

Mapping Future Brisbane launched with an interactive 3D mapping tool, historical research, and details of the machine learning experiments.




Digital Collections Catalyst 2021

Brett Tweedie is a data visualisation designer with degrees in media and politics, and has been making stuff online since the late 90s including:



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There were **468** searches of the State Library of Queensland catalogue with the word 'searching' in it, since April 2012




More than **10 years of text strings searched** in State Library of Queensland's online catalogue.

Historical data is freely available on the Queensland Government **Open Data Portal**.

Current data is sourced through **Google Analytics** and updated daily.


Open data is a key component in our Digital Strategy and State Library's commitment to open data is outlined in our Open Data Strategy. The Strategy includes activities to build digital collections for use and re-use, and activities to position State Library as a lead in the open data movement. A quick overview of searches shows and average of **2,193** searches per day

Peak search **year 2016** Peak search **time 2-3pm** Peak search **day Wednesday** Peak search **month May**




CONTOUR INTERVAL: 5.8 PER 100,000 SEARCHES



State Library of Queensland staff have advised that The Topography of Searching:


Reflects the behaviour of clients when assisting them at service points.

Reinforces the type of support staff are providing to clients at service points.


The Topography of Searching opportunities:

Natural language searches are very common, do our records and user tags have the correct detail to show the results clients are searching for?

Resource Recommender could be used more widely to link clients to information they're looking for **in the catalogue** but is located **outside the catalogue**.




When clients are using **questions** to search, **"How to"** searches are by far the **most popular**.



When looking at data, especially large data sets, the focus often tends to be on what is at the top - the biggest, the latest, the trends - and sometimes the information contained in the less frequent elements can be missed. Almost **40% of searches only ever appeared once**, and a further 6% or so only twice.

There were **3,163,576** (and counting) searches that **only appeared once**.

An interactive landscape based on the language, themes, topics, and terms searched in the State Library's catalogue, showing how they shift and change over time.




