





Background

Librarian Futures Report Part One

Charting the future of the librarian-patron relationship.



- The library 'in the life of the user'
- Key data points:
 - Survey of 4,000 librarians and patrons across 1,500 institutions
 - Interviews with librarians and other stakeholders
 - Contributions from Springshare, scite, OCLC and other Lean Library partners
 - Data from Lean Library on user workflows
 - Student studies conducted for Lean Library at Pearson College London







Discovery

- Google is the most popular search method,
 - It is also the most popular starting point
- Around 1 in 3 students use the library website
 - Around 1 in 10 students start there
- Around 1 in 4 students use the library building
 Around 1 in 20 students start there
- Very few students see no place for the library in supporting their studies...
 - ... but many think of it solely as a building and a collection







to the Question "How do you find resources for your assignments and studies?"




"The mission of the library is not about buildings and collections, but who librarians serve"

S Technology ♥ from Sage

- 27% are very confident
- Results are broadly similar when asked about digital skills or course-related work
- But most students don't see librarians as providing help
- Just 25% of students reported that librarians help them get access to resources



Scaffolding

- Relatively small number of students engaging with extracurricular training
- Quarter of students don't participate at all
- Significant differences between full-time and parttime students




What kinds of additional training, workshops, or other support have you participated in at your college or university that's offered outside of your courses?



Scaffolding

- Slim majority of students say "finding relevant resources" easy
- "Managing time" and "keeping focused on task" are areas where students had the most difficulty
- Students who identify as disabled reported greater levels of difficulty


How easy or difficult do you find the following aspects of preparing assignments?






- Students overwhelmingly identified as independent learners, rather than collaborative learners
- Students are largely satisfied with their academic experience

- Roughly even split between students who will spend less than 15 minutes looking for a resource, 15-30 minutes looking for a resource, and spend 30-60 minutes looking for a resource
- Only 25% of students reported receiving help from librarians for accessing resources, and just 16% said librarians had helped them find good information

How Long Do Students Spend Searching for Resources?





