How does Ex Libris design processes take into consideration 'Library Independence' especially when sharing the same 'Institutional Zone'?

What is Clarivate's ongoing plans for the current product portfolio. For example, there are multiple Library Management Systems?

What are Clarivate's plans for linked open data?

The 'cloud status' page is excellent for reporting system down issues. But how can Ex Libris alert the customer base of functionality issues such as the recent Alma FTP and Z39.50 issue?

Are there plans on changing the API Concurrent API Request Threshold policies?

If an issue is reported in the Sandbox environment and needs to be subsequently reported as a Production issue is there an easy way to replicate the logged information and comments and add it to Salesforce as a Production issue?

What is the timeframe for the new Primo that is based on something else than AngularJS?

What incentives are available to move from heritage products to the current products (e.g. Aleph to Alma)? It would be in the best interest of Ex Libris / Clarivate for institutions to be on the latest product.

What are your AI plans for back-end systems such as Alma and Leganto -- how will they differ from DARA?

Where do you see the future of the user communities such as IGeLU, ELUNA and IUG?

Clarivate now has an extensive suite of products -what are the plans for creating an analytics platform which we can use to cross product reporting as well as benchmarking against similar organizations.
