

Developing priorities

In 2021, the AAFG presented 3 top enhancement requests to ExLibris:

- 1. Respect MARC subfield coding when linking bib headings
- 2. Allow partial linking of name/title headings
- 3. Allow for more partial linking and flipping of subdivided LCSH headings

Starting in 2022, the group began meeting monthly and discussed the priority of these requests. We eventually decided that this order was, in fact, the desired one for enhancements

Respect MARC subfield coding when linking bib headings

- The top 3 priorities of the AAFG need a linking mechanism that can:
 - Narrow linking by excluding some headings from the matching process
 - Broaden linking by supporting more partial linking options
- Our team worked on this infrastructure During 2023
- The first story is ready, and in the process of early testing by the AAFG.



Collaborating on future developments

Understanding the requirements – seeing the requests brought up some questions:

- 1. For name/titles authorities is the title always in subfield t?
- 2. What about special cataloging, e.g. music?
- 3. Which subfields can be safely removed while maintaining accurate matching?
- 4. Is this different for different types of bib headings (e.g. 700 vs. 711)?
- 5. Is this different for different MARC fields (e.g. 100 vs. 700)?

AAFG to the rescue!

Meeting the requirements - challenges

A lot more partial matches in the system mean:


- Many more bib headings to check for better matches each time the linking job runs
- Many more iterations to check for each bib heading longer matching processes per heading
- How can we accommodate while keeping the linking job manageable?

Implemented Punctuation Rules for Updated Bibliographic Records

The following punctuation rules are implemented when bibliographic records are updated from the authority database:
