About RapidILL

- Created by Colorado State University following a disastrous flood affecting their main library facility in 1997.
- Originally developed by ILL staff as a speedy document supply solution.
- Consists of groups of libraries (pods) subscribed to P2P sharing without additional transactional fees.
- Features include automatic processing, routing, and load-levelling to ensure fast, efficient service.
- Acquired in 2019. Now part of the Clarivate suite of products.

APRIL 2020: RapidILL to the Rescue



2022: VALIDATION & POWER

NHS England publishes a market review and options appraisal for resource sharing with RapidILL at the top of the list for document supply solutions.

RapidILL as resilient infrastructure

The **N8 Consortium** of research-intensive Northern universities produces a strategy case study demonstrating the power of RapidILL in combination with UNSUB to fight back against journal publisher price hikes.

2022: Rethinking Document Supply at Cardiff

Systems Librarian Bronwen Blatchford, Cardiff University presents on RapidILL Implementation Benefits:

- Self-ownership verified by RapidILL (not ILL staff)
- Direct-to-borrower delivery enables out-of-hours fulfillment
- Staff time freed up for complex requests

Performance Improvements (2021 vs 2022):

- Average supply time: 4.97 days → 2.54 days (49% faster)
- RapidILL requests: 2.21 days average (86.4% of all digital requests)

2022: Continuous Community Sharing Forum for Interlending: Interlend 2022

RapidILL Workflows

(Carl Jones, University of Edinburgh)

- Carl shares his team's experience joining RapidILL as part of the N8+ test group
- Demonstrates their integrated Alma workflow (with plans to adopt a fully automated workflow)
- Even without full automation, a turnaround time of 13.5 hours (average) is achieved
- Fulfilment jumps from 52. 6% pre-RapidILL to 93% with RapidILL!

RapidILL and WorldShare.

(Alison Dyer, University of East Anglia)

- UEA upgrades WorldShare (OCLC) by adding RapidILL to achieve "A faster, more efficient service with less barriers for users"
- Implementing RapidILL helps safeguard against rising journal costs.
- End to end automation provides 24/7 access for library users
- Alison notes the staff time costs saved.



2023: Lightning Strikes RapidILL UK Community News Stories

We asked Alli Carroll, Electronic Services Manager at the University of East Anglia (UEA), in Norwich, England, what helped the library manage the resource sharing budget better. She shares:

"With one annual subscription fee, rather than having to reconcile individual transaction payments, RapidILL helps us manage our interlending budget more easily as well as saving staff time. " July 21 2023: Manchester Metropolitan University unlocks unlimited borrowing capacity



2024: Further thoughts from FIL

Sep 4, 2024

One Form to Rule Them All.... Update

"We started getting compliments (particularly from lecturers) about how simple and fast the new service was. **Part of this will be because** we automated RapidILL, so article requests with sufficient information would be shunted into RapidILL without any ILL staff intervention and supplied direct to the user at any time of the day or night. For these requests we effectively have a 24/7 service, rather than 9-5pm, Monday-Friday. Cutting out the time the requests languished in the triage team email will have helped dramatically."

Community Reflections

"I first came across RapidILL when we were in COVID lockdown and I got permission from our senior managers team to trial RapidILL and request items through their COVID pod. I'm hugely grateful to all the international libraries that supplied scans to us that summer, while the UK was in chaos.

RapidILL is supplying a large proportion of our article and chapter requests and I'm confident that it will be doing so for years to come ... as our first port of call for article supply.

Joining RapidILL showed us that reciprocal lending can work and is nothing to be afraid of... Our students appreciate the speed of supply of items via RapidILL and once we moved to Alma (where RapidILL could be integrated and supply of documents automated) then it has streamlined the process even further and made article supply to other libraries a doddle."



2025: EPUG UKI Conference Sharing University of Leeds case study

Beth Parry, Senior Operations Manager presents on WHELF+ and RapidILL *Key Innovation: Tiered Workflow Integration*

- WHELF+ Consortium prioritized for books and available content
- **RapidILL** embedded for articles/chapters beyond WHELF+ portfolio
- Mediated ILL for specialized requests (OCLC Shares, UK libraries, British Library, IFLA)

RapidILL handles 28% of total ILL volume at Leeds (breakdown by type of request not known)

- Demonstrates successful complement to regional consortia, with strategic optimization: each service tier handles appropriate content types.
- Smart workflow design leverages strengths of both regional and international networks



2025: What comes next for *RapidILL*?



"The big project we have coming up is "Defining Work Week permanently"

- The goal here is to allow libraries to better define when they receive most of their lending requests.
- This will reduce the time requests are pending at lenders waiting for fulfilment leading to faster turnaround times.
- The IGeLU RapidILL Working Group has helped with information/scoping of this functionality and will be involved with design review as we move forward."
