MELI Annual Conference 2024

The 18th MELI Annual Conference was held in December 2024 at MUZA – Eretz Israel Museum, Tel Aviv. It was the first fully in-person conference since COVID, welcoming over 200 participants and achieving high overall satisfaction.

Preparations are underway for the 2025 MELI Annual Conference, scheduled for December 2025.

Annual Meeting with Ex Libris Management:

The Steering Committee and Chairs of the Alma, Primo and ER PWGs met with Ex Libris management in May 2025 to discuss specific issues that influence the Israeli community.

Working groups activities and achievements:

Alma Product Working Group:

- Resolved indexing and MARC indicator issues
- Fixed UI language inconsistencies between Alma and Leganto
- Improved search behavior for hyphens and apostrophes
- Hebrew support in Metadata Assistant - under review
- RTL improvements expected in the upcoming BIBFRAME editor

Electronic Resources Working Group:

- Added Israeli databases to CDI: Begin-Sadat Center for Strategic Studies, Shalem Foundation, Ben-Yehuda Project, Jerusalem Institute for Policy Research, and Jerusalem Center for Security and Foreign Affairs – currently underway
- Reviewed existing Israeli databases for metadata integrity and access
- Initiated engagement with Israeli vendors for Provider Platform inclusion

Primo Product Working Group:

- Enhanced Hebrew and Arabic retrieval in Primo VE
- Integrated Melingo Arabic component; awaiting new version in Q1 2026
- Improved CDI metadata for Israeli databases (DOI, ISBN, Danacode)
- Addressed UI directionality issues in Primo's interface
- Led request to add Danacode as a local identifier in CDI
- Formed sub-group for NDE UI and MixPanel feedback
