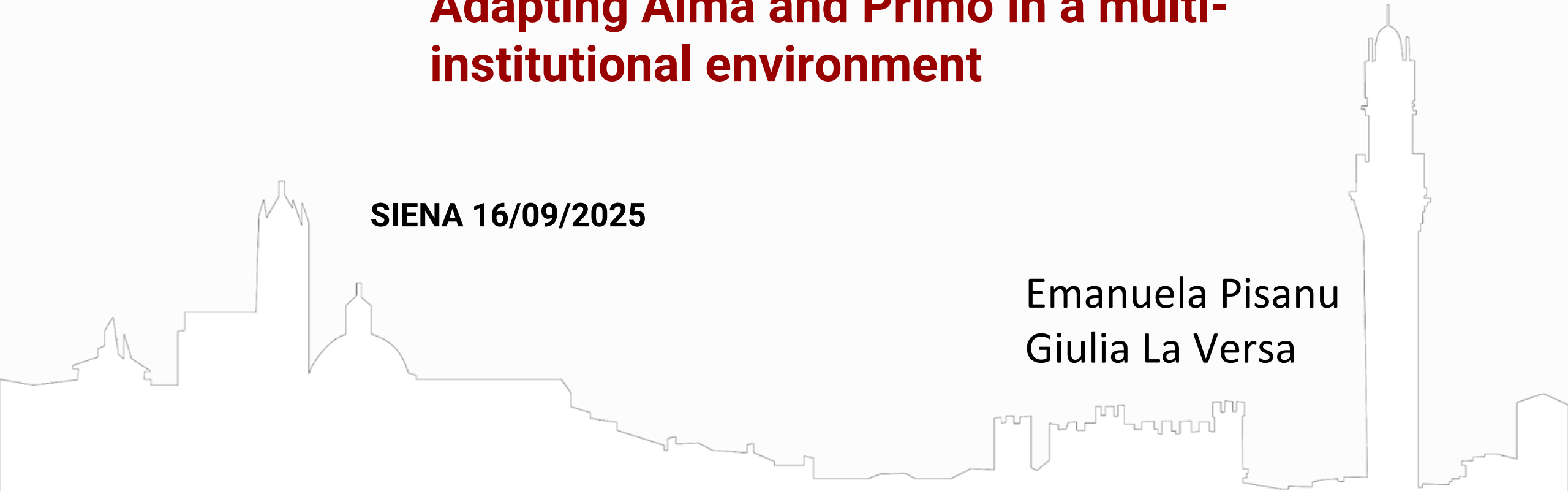

The experience of SBS (Sienese Library System) and SBART (University Library System of the Tuscany Region) represents an innovative model in the national, maybe international, library landscape

Introduction

What is SBS?

Let's start from the end - from what we are today.

SBS - stands for *Servizio Bibliotecario Senese*, or the *Sienese Library Service*

Historical contest

In the 1980s, collaboration projects began between the University of Siena and the Biblioteca Comunale degli Intronati, later joined in the 1990s by the University for Foreigners.

In 2002, **ReDoS** was founded and became part of the SBS system

With the birth and evolution of SBS, the system moved from Sybiblio to Aleph300, and later to Aleph500 — a mature and highly stable product

Introduction

Challenges

Aleph architectures was no longer capable of fulfilling the new strategic function of a University Library System. The motivation for change was its lack in managing electronic resources which accounted the 70% of the Library's budget.

The "Big Change": From Aleph to Alma and Primo

Occurred in 2015, driven by the Ministry's three-year strategic plan (2013-2015). This plan provided funding for the federation and integration of services.

Who are **SBS** and **SBART**?

SBS: Sienese Library System – local consortium

3 ALMA institutions : MAIN, REDOS, FOREIGNERS

How it is composed?

MAIN - 5 university's libraries;

REDOS - 1 municipal library in Siena and 31 libraries scattered in the sienese province;

FOREIGNERS - University for Foreigners and many institutions of Siena (among Accademia dei Fisiocritici, Accademia musicale Chigiana, Istituto Musicale R. Franci, Biblioteca Briganti, Monte dei Paschi, Archivio di stato and Opera del Duomo)

Who are **SBS** and **SBART**?

SBART: University Library System of Tuscany – regional consortium

Born in 2015 first with the adoption of Primo and in 2017 with the adoption of Alma.

The SBART project, which involves the Universities of Florence, Pisa, Siena, the Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies, the University for Foreigners of Siena, and other Tuscan institutions such as the Sienese Documentary Network (REDOS), the Accademia della Crusca, the Franceschini Foundation, and SISMEI, represents an innovative **model of federation**.

This collaboration has allowed us to move beyond the autonomy of individual library systems to foster greater synergy.

Who are **SBS** and **SBART**?

The adoption of **Alma** has enabled:

- A unified management environment for all types of resources—print, electronic, and digital.
- The sharing of cataloging, user management, and lending policies across the network.
- The creation of a single university-regional SBN hub (National Library Service), marking the entry of the Pisa and Siena library systems into the SBN network.
- The formation of a “community of librarians” that transcends individual institutions, providing common spaces for exchange and collaboration in daily work practices.

Who are SBS and SBART?

SBART key strengths:

- A true community of librarians—a broad and inclusive community that goes beyond the boundaries of individual institutions.
- The Network, a shared environment, a common space where opportunities for exchange and collaboration naturally arise as part of everyday work.
- The Current Solid Infrastructure: Collaboration and Technology

The transition from Aleph to Alma (the management system) and Primo/OneSearch (the discovery tool) in 2017 was a crucial step. This migration was driven by the need to integrate the management of electronic resources—which account for about 70% of the University library budget—and to operate at a network level, moving beyond an atomistic approach.

Adapting Alma and Primo

Why we chose **Alma**

- **Electronic Resource Management (ERM)**
- **Complementary to Primo (already adopted by SBART)**
- **Integration with Leganto**
- **Interfacing with SBN,**
- **Reliable technological partner**

The "double jump" (transitioning from Aleph to Alma and simultaneously joining SBN) aimed to share a common catalog and service model at the network level among the universities, contribute to the national SBN project while maintaining autonomy, participate in the international Authority project, simplify cataloging procedures in a period of resource contraction.

Next Steps

Enhancement of SBN:

There is still much work to be done to achieve full integration with the SBN catalog.

Collaboration with the Nuovo Soggettario of the National Central Library of Florence (BNCF) is a prime example of this openness.

It aims to evaluate interoperability procedures with other online resources of common interest and to develop themes related to linked open data.

Authority Projects: Contributing to national authority projects is another explicitly stated goal, which aligns with the effort to support the national SBN project.

Transition to **Primo VE**

Started in January 2023.

Estimated completion within 6 months

Project conclusion May 2025.

Reasons for the Transition to **Primo VE**

Abandonment of the no longer supported (and insecure) authentication system PDS – Patron Directory Service

Adoption of AI developments, available only for Primo VE and not for Primo

Simplify back office processes and optimize management within the Alma platform

Transition to **Primo VE**

Reason for the delay

Greater difficulties for SBS as it is a consortium within Sbart, itself a big consortium

Complex Architecture

- **Primo SBS: integrated bibliographic resources from di UNISI, FOREIGNERS and REDOS**
- **Primo SBART: integrated resources from SBS, UNIFI, UNIPI e Sant'Anna**

Transition to **Primo VE**

Differences Between Primo and Primo VE: Back Office

Primo

Standalone application with a specific URL; access is allowed only from specific IP addresses.

Primo VE

Primo VE is fully integrated with Alma

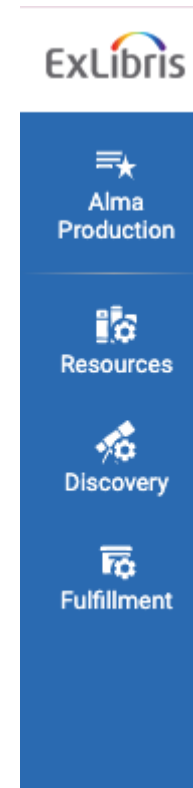
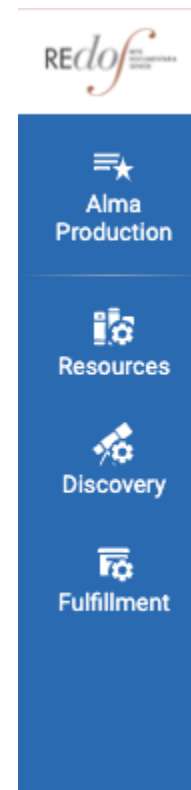
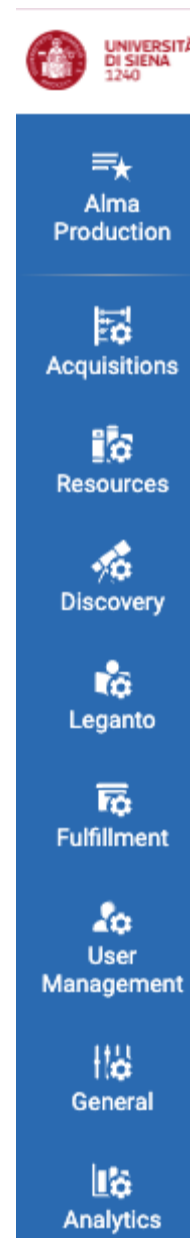
Transition to Primo VE

Transition to **Primo VE**

Differences: Front Office –

PRIMO	PRIMOVE
Charges and new records become visible the following day	Charges and new record become visible immediately (indexing in 15 minutes)
Uniform presentation of UNISI holdings regardless of user authentication	Prioritized display of holdings belonging to the institution the user authenticated with.
Different visualization of related titles: one generic label for all related titles	The titles of all related titles are displayed

Importance of community and collaboration
