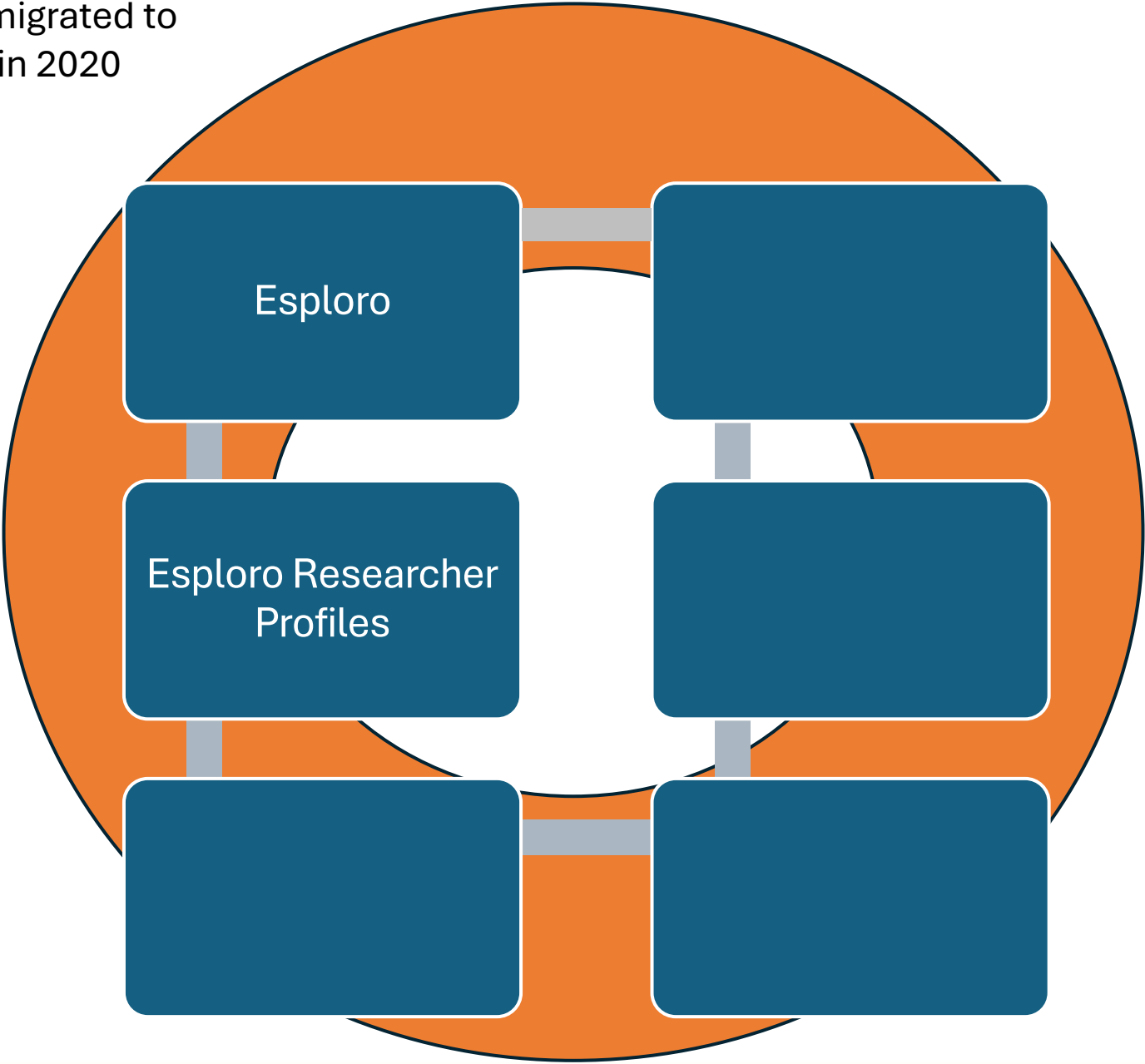

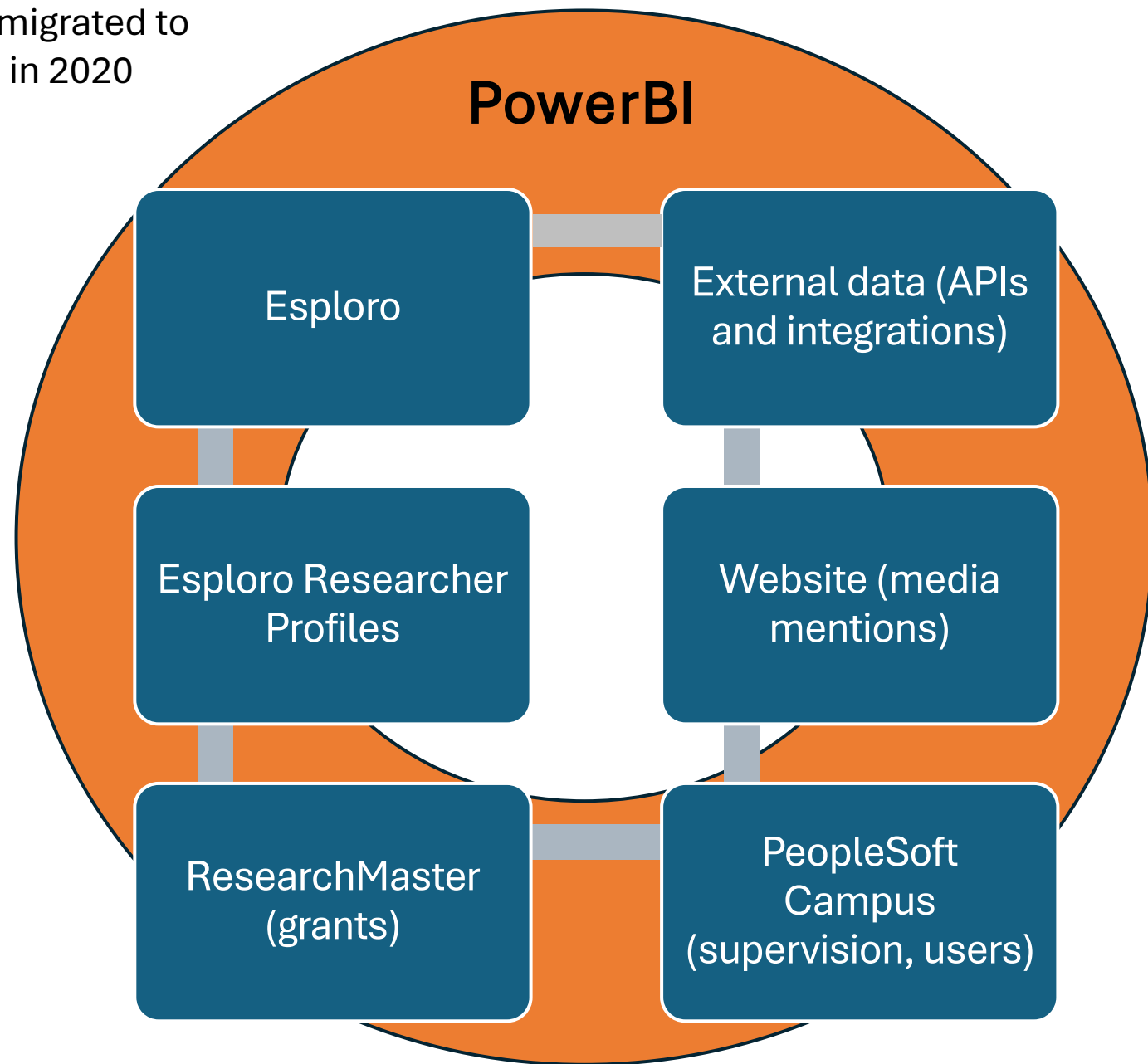

Drivers for using Esploro for impact records

- **Annual reporting requirement:** Research Impact case studies are required for UniSC's schools, centre and institute annual reports.
- **Previous challenge:** Prior to Esploro, there was not system for capturing research impact.
- **Esploro solution:** utilising the projects entity, Esploro provides a central repository for researchers to effectively capture and showcase their research impact.
- **Administrative support:** the system offers streamlined mechanisms for administrators to report on research impact.

What is Research Impact?

Research impact is the contribution that research makes to the economy, society, environment or culture, beyond the contribution to academic research.

Australian Research Council (ARC)

Impact is the effect of the research after it has been adopted, adapted for use, or used to inform further research.

- Grants from **ResearchMaster (RM)** - RMS used by the Office of Research
- Powershell script to convert the RM data to XML
- Maps RM personnel identifiers to Esploro Internal Researcher ID identifiers
- Maps RM funder/fund scheme codes to EROD codes (local and central)
- Automated weekly job to produce a new XML of all grants that have been added or modified in RM, which is then uploaded into Esploro

Esploro Grants

Challenges

- Use 'overlay' instead of 'do not import on match' due to wanting to keep Esploro in sync with any changes that occur in RM
- Overlay XML file in Esploro will wipe any value-added information in the grant record
- Required an additional step in the powershell script to use the Grants API to query Esploro and retrieve any value-added information to add to the XML
- Ongoing maintenance of the researcher and organisation mapping tables

Esploro Activities - Supervision

Supervision data

- Supervision data from **PeopleSoft Campus** system
- For historic records – use the Activities API to add all completed supervision records to Esploro, excluding those already listed
- Ongoing – using the cloud app to create supervision records when the student deposits their thesis to Esploro

Challenges

- Unable to include current supervisions due to the number of changes to supervision teams, student enrollment, thesis titles, etc, throughout the year, and no way to use the API to update these records

Esploro Activities - Teaching

Benefits

- Visibility of academic engagement – how researchers are contributing to student learning and curriculum development.
- Support of promotions and performance reviews.
- Shows how research and teaching intersect.
- Gives a complete view of who our researchers are and what they do.
- Adding another data point to the research and academic impact journey.

Challenge

- The University did not have teaching data that could be used as a source-of-truth for public display, so this was removed from the project scope.

Esploro Media Mentions

Benefits

- Shows the researchers reach beyond the university.
- Demonstrate engagement and influence.
- Important part of the impact journey.

Challenges

- The university did not have media articles in a format that could be automated for capture in Esploro
- Media articles are now added manually monthly by the Library and as requested by the researcher.

Impact - Core Requirements

- The administrator can **configure the impact evidence fields** to be populated (e.g., title, impact description, beneficiaries), including the ability to make some fields mandatory
- The solution allows a researcher to **register impact evidence** for a specific project, including images, documents, videos, URLs, emails, etc
- The solution provides a **user-friendly** public facing project page, along with links to associated impact evidence
- The solution allows the project and associated evidence to be **exported from the system** (e.g., PDF, word or excel)
- The solution allows a researcher to **craft impact stories** linking impact evidence and projects

Globally, approximately 1.2 billion ha of forest is managed for the production of wood and non-wood forest products, with more than 180 million ha used for social services such as recreation, research, and the conservation of cultural and spiritual sites (FAO 2020). Aside from the vital ecosystem services they provide, forests reduce environmental vulnerability and increase the resilience of landscapes and the households of forest dependent people. Monitoring and surveillance of wood beetles at the border

The most important pathways for the arrival of forest pests is through imports of live plants and wood and wood packaging entering at high-risk sites such as border crossings or air and sea/river ports. Biosecurity officers cannot check all incoming goods or people and once an invasive pest arrives, it can be difficult to control. [Show more](#)

- System is not designed for research impact records
- Limited configuration options – not as customisable as desired
- Lack of mediation – there is no review process before a researcher publishes or edits a public project record
