NTU Main Library (總圖書館)	Founded in 1928 and officially opened in 1998, NTU Library initiated the NTUL Remodeling Project in 2014, reopening its first floor in 2023 with a generous donation. It has continuously devoted itself to curating academic resources and preserving campus heritage, becoming the nation's leading university library and an exemplar within the nation.	Link
NTU Koo Chen-Fu Memorial Library (社會科學院辜振甫先生紀念圖書館)	The Koo Chen-Fu Memorial Library has more than 217,000 volumes of collection, featuring around 100,000 books and journals. Designed by Toyo Ito, its unique 1st floor features white columns and stacked bamboo bookshelves. Subject librarians provide reference services for various departments to become the hub of social sciences research.	Link
NTU Medical Library (醫學圖書館)	As the largest medical library in Taiwan, NTUML holds over 120,000 volumes. It features a Medical Humanities Area and upgraded spaces, including a café, Learning Commons, and NTUer Lounge, turning the library into a lively environment to fulfill teaching, research, and healthcare needs. NTU ASRS Service Center (自動化書庫)	Taiwan's first-ever library ASRS stores at least 1.2 million books, five times a traditional shelf's capacity. This automatic system efficiently saves time, allowing users to request items through the online catalog and pick them up at the Service Center.	Link

NTU History Gallery (校史館)	Established in 2005 within the historic Old Main Library, the NTU History Gallery preserves and exhibits the university's evolution since 1928. It manages permanent collections and special exhibition halls to safeguard institutional artifacts and provide a comprehensive record of its heritage.	Link
NTU Library 5F Special Collections (總圖書館五樓特藏)	Houses more than 250,000 items, including materials in the Chinese, Japanese, and Western languages, and notable collections on a variety of subjects.	Link
NTU Museums (臺大博物館群)	Founded in 2007 to make prestigious materials, specimens, and documents more accessible to the public, the NTU Museums network integrates twelve distinct campus galleries to preserve National Taiwan University's rich academic legacy. (More details)

Fu Bell (傳鐘)	Honoring former President Fu Ssu-nien, the Fu Bell rings 21 times to remind students of daily self-reflection, embodying NTU's intellectual spirit.	Link
Administration Building (行政大樓)	Completed in 1926 with red bricks and Corinthian columns, this serene historical building and its front pond are highly photographed on campus.	Link

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Old Main Library (舊總圖)	Inaugurated in 1929 with arched windows and gables, it now serves as the NTU History Gallery, Museum of Anthropology, and Art Museum	Link
College of Liberal Arts (文學院)	Inaugurated in 1929 with Romanesque elements and arched windows, its west side features a Taichi series sculpture by famous local artist Ju Ming.	Link
Royal Palm Boulevard (椰林大道)	Features around a hundred large palm trees on both sides, serving as the main artery and a prominent landmark	Link
Drunken Moon Lake (醉月湖)	Formerly regulating the Liugongjun canal, it was renovated into an eco-friendly lakeshore surrounded by modern academic buildings and a mid-lake pavilion.	Link
The First Student Activity Center (第一學生活動中心)	Designed by Wang Da-hong, this modern Chinese architectural exemplar features traditional colors and pleated roofing, serving as a vibrant student hub.	Link
Liugongjun Pool (瑠公圳水源池)	Part of the canal restoration project engineered under ecological guidelines, it has become a thriving wildlife habitat and great birdwatching spot.	Link
Agricultural Experiment Farm (農業試驗場)	A green field site used for agricultural experiments and university courses, offering a peaceful shield from the bustling noise of Keelung Road.	Link
Fu Garden (傅園)	Originally a tropical arboretum for research, it now features a Greek Parthenon style monument and mausoleum honoring University President Fu Ssu-nien.	Link
Agricultural Exhibition Hall (農業陳列館)	Founded in 2007, this collaborative network integrates 12 distinct campus galleries and museums to share rich academic legacies with the public.	Link
